W: I do.

Will you please face each other and join hands and will the groom please repeat after me:

M: I take thee BRIDE to be my wedded wife, to have and to hold from this day forward, for better or for worse, for richer or poorer, in sickness and in health; to love, cherish and honor.

Will the Bride repeat after me:

W: I take thee GROOM to be my wedded husband, to have and to hold from this day forward, for better or for worse, for richer or poorer, in sickness and in health; to love, cherish, and honor.

(The best man hands the ring to the bridegroom and he places the ring on the hand of the bride saying)

M: With this ring I thee wed.

(In a double ring wedding the bride places the ring on the hand of the groom saying)

W: With this ring I thee wed.
